History of the Fund

In 2014 a donor from the congregation of 1st UUPB donated funds to be used to offer scholarships to those who are choosing to enroll in either public, private colleges or trade schools. Our denomination seeks economic justice and offers scholarships to students without any restrictions placed on eligibility. **However, those students who have demonstrated involvement in social justice work and can state a plan for future social justice work will receive priority.**

History of Harriet Glasner

A founding member of this congregation, Harriet Glasner was devoted to justice. After her arrival in Palm Beach County in 1952, she became a trailblazer advocating for civil rights, women's rights, reproductive justice and human rights.

Eligibility for Awards

- Applicants must have earned or be in the process of earning a high school diploma or a GED in Palm Beach County.
- Applicants must be enrolling in a private or public college, university, or trade school.
- Recipients must agree to participate in the award service of the congregation in May.

The number and amount of awards may vary from year to year. Each award may be up to \$5000. Administrators of the fund will review applications and announce awards by May 5th.
